# Interrogative Sentences

We can simply say that interrogative sentences are *Questions*.

- *Where are you from?*
- *Whose book is it?*
- *Do you play basketball?*
- *Have you taught online?*
- *Can you swim?*

 We always use a question mark “?” at the end of interrogative sentences.


# Imperative Sentences

*When we command/order/force/obligate someone to do something, we are using imperative sentences.*

*It expresses a direct command, request, invitation, warning, or instruction and it do not require a subject.*

- *Close the window.*
- *Do your homework!*
- *Be quiet!*
- *Turn off the TV.*
- *Don't smoke!*

 *We can use an exclamation mark "!" at the end of imperative sentences to make them stronger. (Like it shows you're serious or angry, etc.)*

# Assertive Sentences

*A sentence which asserts a statement, incident, fact, feeling, event, opinion, or belief is an assertive sentence. AKA Declarative Sentences*

- *No individual is entirely free .*
- *No individual can live indefinitely .*
- *The sun does not rotate around the earth .*
- *The blind are unable to see .*
- *Barking dogs don't bite.*
- *Honesty is the best policy.*

# Exclamatory Sentences

When we are expressing our feelings or being surprised or when we're talking about something exciting, we can use exclamatory sentences.

- *Such a nice day!*
- *Such good news!*
- *How smart you are!*
- *What a great teacher!* 😊
- *WOW!*
- *OMG!*
- *Watch out!*

⚠️ We use an exclamation mark "!" to express the feeling.

# Optative Sentences

*When a sentence refers to 'wish', 'desire', or 'bless', it can perform as an optative sentence.*

- *Wish you a wonderful day.*
- *May you succeed in all your endeavours.*
- *Wish you many more returns of the day.*
- *Happy Birthday!*
- *All the best!*

## *Passive Optative Sentence:*

- *May God bless them!*
- *May you be blessed by God!*
