Clauses

Overview:

Clauses are the heart of English grammar. They help us build strong sentences—from the simplest ideas to the most complex ones.

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What Is a Clause?

A **clause** is a group of words that contains a subject and a verb. It can be either a complete sentence or a part of a sentence.

- ***** Examples:
- ✓ I love pizza. 💗
- ✓ When she arrived, I was cooking. 🐖
- Two Main Types:

Туре	Explanation	Example
Independent Clause	Can stand alone as a sentence	She is reading a book. 🛄
Dependent Clause	Cannot stand alone; needs support	Because it was raining 🥋

💡 **Tip:** Every sentence in English has at least one clause!

Independent Clauses

A dependent clause cannot stand alone. It depends on an independent clause to make sense.

- Begins with words like: because, although, when, if, unless, since
- * Examples:
- ✓ Although I was tired, I went to work. z^zZ
- ✓ If you study hard, you'll pass. 듣
- X Incorrect: Because I was late.
- ✓ Correct: Because I was late, I missed the bus. 🥽

Adjective Clauses (Relative Clauses)

An **adjective clause** describes a noun and begins with a relative pronoun: *who, which, that, whose, whom.*

- ★ Examples:
- ✓ The woman **who lives next door** is a doctor. 🧟
- ✓ I read a book that inspired me.
- guse who for people and which/that for things.
- X Common Mistakes:
- ♦ The man which lives here is friendly. X
- ✓ The man **who** lives here is friendly. ✓

Adverb Clauses

An adverb clause describes when, where, why, or how something happens.

- Begins with: because, although, since, when, after, before, while, if, unless
- * Examples:
- ✓ I'll call you when I arrive. ****
- ✓ Because he was hungry, he ate three burgers. ●●●
- You can move these clauses to the beginning or end of the sentence!
- ✓ If it rains, we'll stay inside. 🌱
- ✓ We'll stay inside if it rains.

Noun Clauses

A **noun clause** acts as a subject, object, or complement in a sentence.

- Begins with: that, what, whatever, who, whoever, how, when, where, why
- ★ Examples:
- ✓ What you said surprised me. 😲
- ✓ I don't know why she left.
- They often answer what? or who?
- X Mistake:
- **◊** I don't know what did she say. **×**
- ✓ I don't know what she said. ✓

Combining Clauses (Compound & Complex Sentences)

To make writing richer, we combine clauses.

Compound Sentence:

2 Independent Clauses + Coordinating Conjunction

✓ I was tired, **but** I kept studying. 🖵

Complex Sentence:

Independent Clause + Dependent Clause

- ✓ Although I was nervous, I gave the speech.
- 💡 Use commas after dependent clauses when they come first!

Advanced Notes

- Run-on Sentences
- **◊** I love this movie it is amazing. **×**
- ✓ I love this movie. It is amazing. ✓
- ✓ I love this movie, and it is amazing. ✓
- Fragment Clauses
- ♦ When he arrived. X (Incomplete thought)
- ✓ When he arrived, we had dinner. ✓
- Nominal Clauses in Formal Writing
- ✓ That she resigned was unexpected.
- ✓ Subjunctive in Noun Clauses
- ✓ I suggest that he **be** on time. (Not "is") 🕭
- ✓ Reduced Clauses (For fluency and style)
- ✓ Students living in dorms must follow the rules.
- (= Students who live in dorms)
